FAMILY FOCUS The Lomas Family

Crystal Lomas is a resident of Bryan, Texas and proud mother of five children. Crystal and her kids-Daisy, David, Derick, Dianne, and Lino- currently live together in an old, two-bedroom mobile home.

With six people living in two bedrooms, their current house lacks space for the kids to grow and play. Beyond significant repair issues, the mobile home is located in an unsafe neighborhood for the children.



After two years of trying to purchase an affordable home through a conventional loan, Crystal Lomas was not hopeful when she applied for the Habitat homeownership program. Since being approved, Crystal has been working hard on her sweatequity hours in preparation for the building of her home.

Bryan/College Station Habitat for Humanity doesn't just sell homes, it sets homebuyers up for success by requiring them to attend home maintenance and financial fitness classes. The home maintenance classes teach preventive care, and the budgeting classes stress fiscal responsibility and restraint.


Through the completion of these sweat equity hours and the homeownership classes, Crystal is ready to be a new homeowner. She has loved all people she has met through this process.

DECLARATION DAY



The Bryan/College Station area has grown into a thriving community that many are proud to call home. The love for this community is evident in the selfless service of its local residents and the students from Texas A&M University and Blinn College. Since its founding, Bryan/College Station Habitat for Humanity has been the recipient of countless service hours from individuals and large groups alike.

One such group was a local church in particular that has played an integral role in service over the last year. Declaration Church has been partnering with B/CS Habitat since April of 2021. Two staff members in charge of Neighbor Relations, Ben Markow and Mallory Kappel, attended the 2021 Community Builders Breakfast alongside Habitat staff member, Hayley Pennesi. It was at this event that Ben and Mallory experienced the call to action to engage their members in meaningful service with Habitat for Humanity.

Ben and Mallory became members of B/CS Habitat's Faith in Action Committee and joined over nine other local churches in serving our Habitat families. When asked what inspired them to take the next step in partnering with B/CS Habitat, they said, "We want to be a blessing to our community and serve our neighbors. [Declaration Church]'s mission is declaring and demonstrating the gospel to Bryan/College Station and beyond. We get to do the part of declaring and demonstrating the gospel through Habitat."

Assistant Director of Development and Faith Relations, Hayley Pennesi, oversees the Faith in Action Committee and was excited to see the enthusiasm Ben and Mallory carried as a team. "Declaration Church has been an incredible asset to our Faith in Action Committee", says Hayley. "When I met Ben and Mallory, it was evident that these two had the passion to serve our community and guide their members to do the same. They are an incredible example of being engaged and living out the Habitat mission of putting God's love into action. Declaration Church is consistently represented at our meetings and events ready to be a part of the work that needs to be done in order to better serve our community and Habitat families."

On Saturday, April 9, Declaration Church gathered nearly 100 studentmembers of their congregation to volunteer. These volunteers participated in a neighborhood revitalization and beautification initiative by painting four B/CS Habitat homes and meeting with the homeowners. The work and heart of these volunteers had a tangible impact on the lives of these four Habitat families. Homeowner Patricia Robertson said, "I thank each of you for your service, I really enjoyed meeting such an awesome group of people. It's the love that we have for Christ that bonds us together...true servants of God."

Volunteer Spotlight Betty Morgan

Betty Morgan, a loyal and dedicated volunteer for the B/CS Habitat Paint Crew, spent the month of March putting the final touches on the paint to four different Habitat homes dedicated that month. As the houses were finished and the families moved in, she smiles knowing that she had a part in turning these houses into homes.

Betty began working on the Paint Crew in 2014 when her friend, Dr. Murray Milford, invited her to join what was then a one-man Habitat Paint Crew. The crew has now grown to include over six individuals who volunteer their time consistently throughout the week for different construction projects. "Our goal is to give families a place that they can call home: one that's comfortable and looks like it was done right," says Betty, "they put so much work into their homes, it's only right that we do the same."

Betty recalled learning firsthand how dedicated and involved Habitat homeowners

are in building their own houses when she worked alongside a homeowner, saying "she was a single mother...and she would come out here past when us volunteers would go home. That's when I realized she really wants this house." Betty has seen that, for thankful Habitat homeowners, this kind of dedication is a very common theme. Betty is



always deeply moved by their dedication to their future homes.

It's been nearly eight years, that Betty has been working with the homeowners and Habitat staff, and she still has that deep motivation to continue to donate her time to B/CS Habitat and its partner families. "We are people with the same focus, coming together to achieve something greater," Betty shares. Habitat's impact on the community further motivates her to volunteer because she "[understands] the value of Habitat's mission and how important housing is to build, not just for individual families but also for communities."

Betty has seen areas, such as Angel Gate, go from undeveloped land to

66 Habitat homes bring back this sense of community neighborhoods where kids play together outside and "neighbors help their neighbors." To Betty, "Habitat homes bring back this sense of community. It reminds [her] of [her] own childhood when a sense of community was vital, and those who lived together supported one another." It is thanks to volunteers like Betty that Habitat for Humanity is able to build neighborhoods like Angel's Gate, and bring a sense of community back to Bryan/College Station.
